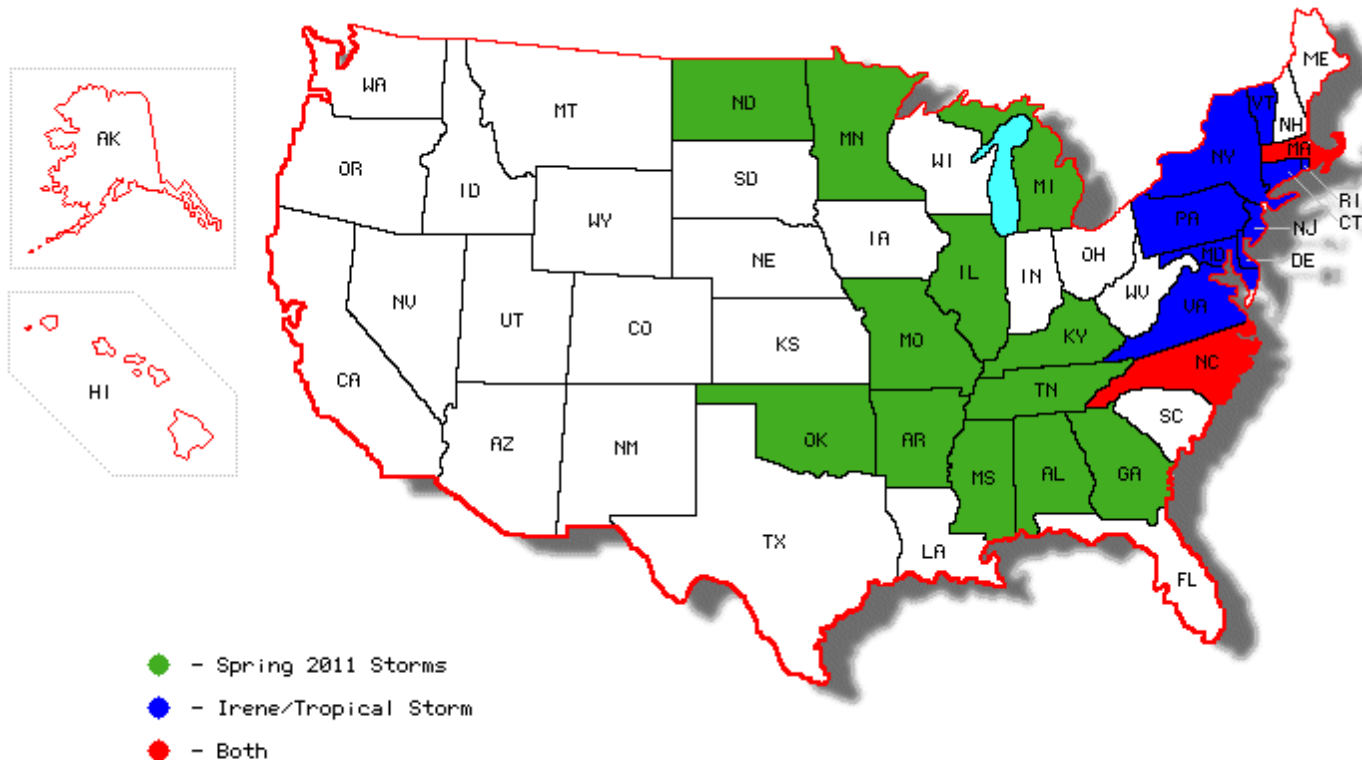


States with Disaster SNAP Assistance in 2011



Disaster SNAP

Disaster SNAP (DSNAP) provides replacement benefits for regular SNAP/Food Stamp recipients who lose food in a disaster. DSNAP also extends benefits to many households which would not ordinarily be eligible but suddenly need food assistance.

This map highlights the states that have hosted DSNAP. For the severe storms of Spring 2011, DSNAP provided over \$150 million dollars in SNAP benefits directly to disaster victims. Over 1.1 million individuals in over 200 counties received assistance. Efforts in response to Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee are ongoing.
