Dear Member of Congress:

The Food Research & Action Center (FRAC) urges you to oppose and vote no on the House Farm Bill.

The bill would lock in the harmful \$187 billion in SNAP cuts enacted under H.R. 1 for the next five years, increasing hunger and straining [state budgets](#).

SNAP is a powerful tool that keeps our nation's families fed while fueling farmers, local economies, and food retailers. By failing to restore any of the cuts to SNAP, the House Farm Bill continues to advance policies that threaten the health and well-being of millions of people, communities, and the country.

The impact of SNAP cuts is already being felt in [your district](#) and in every district across the country, whether rural, urban, or suburban. None of your constituents should worry about how they will afford to keep food on the table. Yet the House Farm Bill does nothing to restore SNAP and instead reinforces the policies set out in H.R. 1 that strip food assistance from children, older adults, people with disabilities, veterans, and many others. The bill also weakens legitimate trained, workforce and privatizes it. And it sends the wrong message to those who are working on real farm relief by weakening the traditional alignment of farms and families (SNAP) that has successfully negotiated and advanced farm bills for decades.

This is unacceptable.

The Farm Bill must reflect the shared priorities of ensuring families can access the nutrition they need and support farmers.

The House should reject this bill and return to the table to produce a Farm Bill that delivers for both farmers and families. Otherwise, no Farm Bill is better than a bad Farm Bill.
