## **Organizational Background**

FRAC works to improve the nutrition, health, and well-being of people struggling against poverty-related hunger in the United States through advocacy, partnerships, and by advancing bold and equitable policy solutions. In partnership with hundreds of national, state, and local nonprofit organizations, public agencies, corporations, and labor organizations, FRAC strives to build a nation in which all people have the nutritious food they need to lead healthy and productive lives.

## **Responsibilities**

The summer intern will support FRAC's Director of Special Projects & Initiatives on a range of legal issues pertaining to the elevated levels of food insecurity resulting from the COVID-19 economic and health crisis. The intern will conduct research related to addressing hunger among older adults, immigrants, and other groups. Work may also include engaging people with lived expertise in advocacy. The intern will also support FRAC's work to encourage health providers to screen and intervene to address food insecurity.
