Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

In Delaware

- SNAP reaches 68,878 households with 141,986 individuals in an average month (FY 2016).¹
- SNAP helps 1 in 8 households in metro areas afford healthy, nutritious meals.²

- More than 80% of SNAP families had at least one working member in the past 12 months.
- A very small number of SNAP households (6% or 4,000) participate in TANF, making SNAP a critical safety net for families with children.
- Nearly half of all SNAP households included children.

² For the purpose of this analysis, **"Metro Areas"** are metropolitan statistical areas as delineated by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), each of which contains at least one Census Bureau-delineated urbanized area of 50,000 or more people. Delaware is an entirely metro area.

⁴ Based on the Census Bureau definition, **family** consists of a householder and one or more other people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage or adoption.
